The 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual Science and History Conference is being hosted by Waterton-Glacier International Peace Park on Thursday, August 18, 2005 at the Lake McDonald Lodge Auditorium. The conference will feature 14 presentations of ongoing or recently completed research projects in Glacier and Waterton Lakes National Parks. Talks will be non-technical in nature and geared toward the general public. All persons interested in learning more about research on the natural and cultural resources of the Peace Park are invited to attend.

The conference will begin at 8:30 a.m. and will be organized into 2 morning and 2 afternoon sessions with a lunch break from noon until 1:15 p.m. Refreshments will be available during scheduled breaks, courtesy of the Glacier Natural History Association. Lunch may be purchased at the Lake McDonald Lodge or you may prefer to bring your own and enjoy an outdoor lunch along the lake shore. Parking space is limited so persons attending are encouraged to share rides and car-pool to the extent possible.

The 20-minute presentations will feature a wide variety of topics including bear research, global change, avalanche, and paleoclimate studies, fisheries and floodplain investigations, wildlife and fire ecology studies, and historical and cultural research projects. Science and Resources Management Chief, Jack Potter will open and close the event and Park Superintendent Mick Holm will welcome attendees during the opening session at 8:30 a.m. Session speakers include US and Canadian researchers from universities, government and tribal agencies, and private consulting firms.
