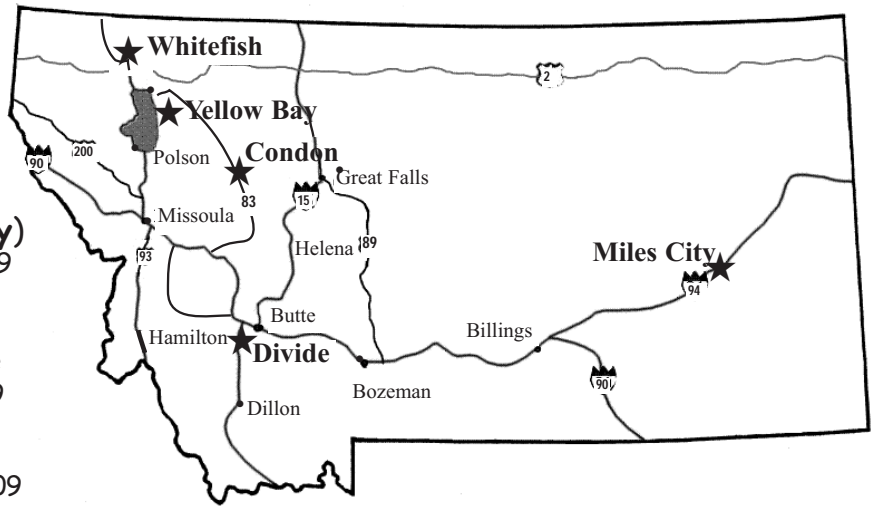

Workshop Commitments:

Our Commitment: The Forest Stewardship Workshop will provide practical information, a course notebook, topographic map/aerial photograph of your property, and the tools and equipment necessary for you to learn more about your property.

Your Commitment: As part of the workshop, you must be willing to spend 16-24 hours between days 2 and 3 of the workshop on your property completing a stewardship inventory and gathering vital information about your property.

Result: During the course of the workshop, you will develop a Forest Stewardship Plan designed to achieve the goals you have for your property. You can verify your plan following the 3rd day of the workshop during a visit with an advisor.

Each workshop includes:

- 3 home-study videos to gear up for class then
- Two all-day sessions followed by
- A 4-6 day period to complete a **stewardship inventory** of your property followed by
- One all-day session

Workshop Registration Fee:

\$75 per ownership. Additional family members and/or partners are encouraged to come. \$45 per additional workshop manual. Registration fees are not refundable after the application deadline, but can be applied towards a future workshop. Yellow Bay lodging/meal fees are refundable prior to July 30, 2009.

Come to the Forest Stewardship Workshop at Yellow Bay!!

The Flathead Lake Biological Station is located on a peninsula that shelters Yellow Bay from the main body of Flathead Lake. The grounds include a springbrook and a mixed species forest of Douglas fir, ponderosa pine and larch.

Commercial lodging and dining facilities are limited in the immediate vicinity of Yellow Bay. For this reason an optional lodging and meal package is available to workshop participants.

Lodging at Yellow Bay: If you choose to stay at Yellow Bay accommodations are:

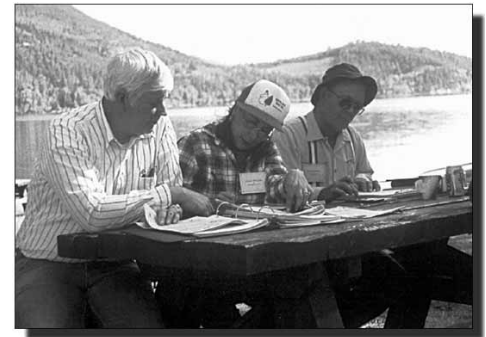
1. Residence hall with double or single occupancy dorm-style rooms with shared shower facilities.
2. Rustic, comfortable cabins with electricity, for one or two occupants. (Common restroom/bathhouse facilities are nearby).

Bedding and towels are provided; however, there is no daily maid service.

Meal package: There are no alternative commercial dining establishments nearby, so a 3 lunch and/or all meal (3 lunch, 1 breakfast, 1 dinner) packages are available. Meals are cafeteria-style dining. There are picnic tables nearby if you choose to bring your own lunch and eat on site.

Transportation: UM Biological Station at Yellow Bay, on scenic Flathead Lake, is located halfway between Polson and Bigfork on Highway 35. Missoula and Kalispell are accessible by commercial flights; rental cars are available.

Daily Schedule - ALL LOCATIONS

Day 1: Check-in: 7:30 - 8:00 am

Indoor class 8 am - noon & 1 pm - 5 pm

Day 2: Indoor class 8 am - noon & Outdoor 1 pm - 5 pm

Between Days 2 and 3:

Travel to your property. You will be supplied with equipment necessary to perform a stewardship inventory on your property. Be prepared to spend from 16-24 hours depending on the size and accessibility of your property.

Day 3: Indoor class 8 am - noon & 1 pm - 5 pm

Immediately following the workshop:

You will have the opportunity to certify your newly developed, Forest stewardship Plan. This is usually accomplished during a 2-6 hour on-site consultation with a Stewardship Advisor.

This is a great opportunity for one-on-one interaction on managing your forest!
